Boost your business: If you're self-employed, there are many courses that can help you to grow your business – from e-commerce to project management. Part-time, short courses and distance learning study options allow you to fit your educational goals around your current working day.

THE RIGHT COURSE FOR YOU

From sports massage to project management, e-commerce to professional writing, Cornwall's colleges and universities offer an incredible range of courses, allowing you to find the option that matches your interests, needs and aspirations.

COURSE OPTIONS

Access Diploma: provides the relevant qualification for many degree and HE courses. Examples include nursing and computing.

University level short courses: offer flexible, part-time study. Examples include Business Management, Hospitality & Tourism, IT, Sustainability and Professional Writing.

Foundation degrees: combines academic study with work-based learning. Examples include Art & Design and Sport & Leisure.

HND: offers vocational training with a strong grounding in practical skills. Examples include Sound Engineering and Complementary Therapies.

NVQ: 'competence-based' qualification designed to teach practical, work-related skills and knowledge. Five levels available. Examples include Health & Social Care and Furniture Making.

Bachelors degrees: BA, BSc, BM. Minimum three years of study. Examples include Renewable Energy, English and Graphic Design.

Postgraduate study: Masters, doctorates, certificates and diplomas. Examples include Television Production and Minerals Engineering.

STUDY OPTIONS

Full-time: usually from one to three years in length.

Part-time: allow you to enter higher education while maintaining a part-time job.

Evening study: gives you the flexibility to work during the day.

Short courses: range from one-day workshops to weekly classes over three months, providing a great introduction to a variety of subjects - or just a chance to top up your skills and boost your earning potential.

Distance learning: delivered entirely online, offering great flexibility if you want to study and continue your job or have commitments that keep you at home.

Blended learning: delivered predominantly online but with some lectures and workshops. Like distance learning, these courses are perfectly suited to people who want to carry on working while they study.

CORNWALL'S CHANGING FACE

Cornwall's business landscape is changing. It is pioneering low carbon development, expanding its creative industries and investing in its growing digital economy (including £132 million into Next Generation Broadband over the next three years).

This means plenty of exciting jobs if you have the right skills. The average starting salary for a graduate in Cornwall is now £19,307 (source: Unlocking Cornish Potential).

Over £50 million has recently been invested into Cornwall's higher education facilities.

Returning to education is an investment in your future.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

Your main costs are your tuition fees and your living costs. Maximum full-time student tuition fees are:

- £3,375 for 2011/12
- Up to £9,000 for 2012/13 (only applies to first-time students entering HE after September 2012). This will vary by institution and you should ask your chosen university or college.

If you're thinking about becoming a part-time student, you should contact the universities and colleges you are interested in to find out about the fees.

IS THERE HELP AT HAND?

Yes. Tuition Fee Loans help you pay for your studies. These are for the full cost of your tuition fees, and are paid directly to your university or college. From 2012/13, tuition fee loans are also available for part-time students, who spend at least 25% of their time studying.

You do not pay your tuition fee loan back until you graduate and start earning. For example, the starting salary for a newly qualified teacher is around £21,500. Someone on this wage would make monthly repayments of less than £30 a month. Graduates who earn more will repay more each month.

There are also Maintenance loans to help with your living costs. The amount you can borrow depends on a variety of factors, including where you live and when you will start your course.

IS IT JUST LOANS? IS THERE ANY HELP I DON'T HAVE TO PAY BACK?

Yes. Maintenance grants are also available to eligible students to help with your living costs (like accommodation, food and books), depending on your household income. These grants DO NOT have to be paid back.

WHEN DO I HAVE TO PAY IT BACK?

Under current arrangements, if you begin your course before September 2012 you won't have to start re-paying your Tuition Fee or Maintenance loans until you are earning at least £15,000. If you start studying in September 2012 or later, you will not start paying back your Tuition Fee loan until you are earning at least £21,000.

WHAT OTHER HELP COULD I GET?

You may also be eligible for one or more of the following:

From 2012/13 there will be a new £150m National Scholarship Programme to help students from lower income families. This is still to be finalised.

Bursaries and scholarships: These are available to help with tuition fees and don't have to be paid back. Contact the university or college of your choice to find out more.

What if I'm on benefits? If you're currently receiving benefits and want to know how these may be affected by returning to study, please contact the student services team at the university or college you are looking to attend.

What if I have children? You could be entitled to additional financial support, including a Childcare Grant and Child Tax Credits.

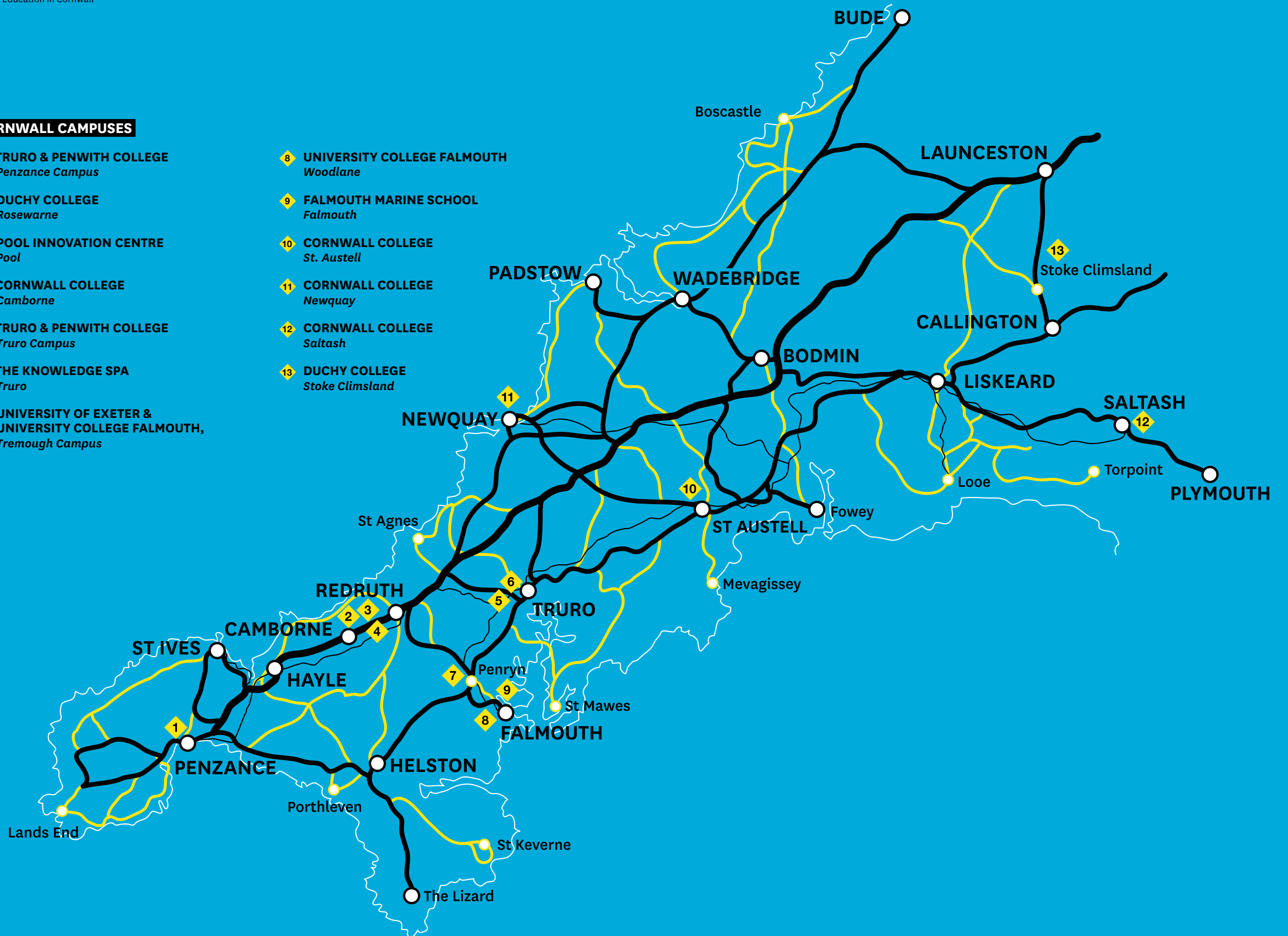
